sea. It was commissioned into active service in 2016. These ships will feature a state-of-the-art electric propulsion system, wave-piercing tumblehome hull, stealth design, and the latest war fighting technology and weaponry available.

However, the Navy cancelled the *Zumwalt* due to skyrocketing costs, lack of accountability, unrealistic goals, a flawed concept of operations, the perils of designing a warship around stealth, and the failure of the Advanced Gun System. From the <u>Business Insider</u>, Mr. Fredenburg stated the *Zumwalt* was an unmitigated disaster.

The *Zumwal*t will go into dry dock in late 2023 for an 18-month maintenance and get outfitted with hypersonic missiles in 2024 and 2025 in Pascagoula, Mississippi.
