Our speaker was Cindy Pullen from Lakeland. She worked for Xerox for 36 years (in 7 different states) and then retired and moved to a farm in Lanier County, working with horses. She joined a national non-profit called Personal Ponies that breeds and trains ponies to help special needs children and adults of all ages. She is President and CEO of Personal Ponies. Also, she has been the Lanier County liaison with Moody. And for the last 10 years has been the co-chair of the South GA Military Affairs Council whose purpose is keeping Moody in south GA.

She related that when the "pony reads to a child" with difficulties the child later would read to the pony and eventually the class. The ponies are a special breed that can be taught to respond but not react so that they learn to trust the handlers. Life span of the ponies is 25-30 years.

Happy 232nd birthday, Coast Guard

"The US Coast Guard recently made history when the first female Admiral was sworn in as the 27th Commandant of the Coast Guard. Adm Linda Fagan is also the first woman to lead a US military service. The Coast Guard is the only US military service not part of the Defense Department. More than 50,000 service members operate about 260 cutters, more than 1600 small boats and about 200 aircraft and helicopters in all US coastal waters, major inland, waterways, and overseas territories. In times of war, the CG is transferred to the US Navy which happened in both WWI and WWII."

On March 1, 2003, the CG was transferred from the Department of Transportation to the Department of Homeland Security. (MOAA Magazine Aug 2022)

The AF turned 75 on September 18. It symbolized "American ingenuity, industrial might, and sheer audacity. It produced the world's fastest airplanes and its most lethal and intimidating weapons."
